## Primary Care Networks (PCNs)

Hopefully you are all aware of the latest acronym, PCN, that is front and centre in all NHS based discussions at the moment.

PCNs are intended to provide services that are appropriate and necessary for the particular community that they serve. All GPs are required to align themselves with a PCN but, crucially, they are also required to work with a full range of other healthcare professionals who are serving the same community, in order to provide the most effective health service and fulfil the ambitions of the NHS Long Term Plan.

As community pharmacies are also being identified as important providers of prevention, screening, and urgent and emergency care services we are well placed to play an important role within PCNs.

However, this is now the critical time for all those in community pharmacy to ensure that they have established good relationships with the surgeries in their neighbourhood so that they are recognised, and included, as valuable partners in achieving the aims of the PCNs.

Currently, we do not have any specific information to share with you about the PCNs across our patch, as the deadline for their formation will not be reached until the middle of May.
