Further extension to SSP08

The Department of Health and Social Care (DHSC) has provided an update on the Serious Shortage Protocols (SSPs) for Salazopyrin® EN-Tabs 500mg (SSP08).

SSP08 for Salazopyrin® EN-Tabs 500mg was previously expected to expire on 22nd January 2021 but the end date has been further extended to **8th March 2021**

Medicine supply notifications

Community pharmacy teams should note that DHSC has issued Medicine Supply Notifications for the following products:

- <u>Colestid (colestipol) orange and plain 5g granules sachets</u>
- <u>Desmopressin (DDAVP) 0.01% w/v (100 micrograms/ml) intranasal</u> solution
- Morphine Sulphate granules for oral suspension (MST Continus)
- <u>Sancuso (granisetron) 3.1mg/24 hours transdermal patches</u>

PSNC's website has a large number of answers to queries posed by pharmacy contractors, their teams, and LPCs; these are updated on a regular basis. Recent additions include:

Q. How many referrals for the Discharge Medicines Service (DMS) will most pharmacies receive?

The number of referrals will inevitably vary from pharmacy to pharmacy, even when the service is fully mature, as the patient profile of individual pharmacies and the likelihood of their patients being admitted to hospital and then being referred to the DMS at discharge will vary. At the commencement of the service in early 2021, not all hospitals are yet ready to make referrals to the service, so some pharmacies will not start to receive referrals on a regular basis until local Trusts have engaged with the service. Both these factors make it difficult to accurately model the likely number of referrals that an average pharmacy will receive, once the service has fully matured, but our current best estimate is around 12 referrals per year.
