

10.	<p>Joint Chief Officer Report/Update</p> <p>Alison Freemantle updated the committee on her activities during the previous two months with both written and verbal reports:</p> <p>Lowlights:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Only 76% of pharmacies claimed for Tier 1 Winter funding – can't give it away. • Teach and treat – ICB still waiting for money from NHSE potentially delaying the start of the project. <p>Highlights:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • National EHC consultations for November 25 shows double the number of consultations carried out in Hampshire County Council area compared to Nov 24 using the Locally commissioned service (LCS). • Portsmouth stop smoking PGDs agreed (includes use of pharmacy technicians, includes walk in patients not just referrals and a sustainable fee structure). <p>A Pysz updated the committee on his activities during the previous two months with both written and verbal reports:</p> <p>Highlights:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • PCN Leads project in Portsmouth will continue for another year. Early indications show improved communication and promising progress.
