This daily update contains important information for community pharmacy teams about the ongoing response to the COVID-19 pandemic.

Independent Review Update: New Review Steering Group to take forward work on contractor support and representation

PSNC and LPCs have been working closely together since the publication of the findings of Professor David Wright's independent review into contractor representation and support.

The outcome of the review was published over the summer and it resulted in 33 recommendations for the future of PSNC and the LPCs. **You can read about the report** and its findings here.

It is clear that the recommendations need to be explored in more detail, particularly looking at the benefits they would bring, the feasibility of implementing them, and any associated costs. To take forward that work, PSNC last month proposed to LPCs the formation of a group, called the Review Steering Group (RSG).

Key points about the RSG include:

- It will be made up of contractors to ensure fair representation of all groups of contractors;
- Its role will be to explore Professor Wright's recommendations in more detail and to come up with a workable proposal for the sector;
- The Group will need to commission work to help it to do this this will be through
 working and engagement groups made up of wider groups of people from across the
 sector, and possibly using external experts and consultants;
- This work will be funded initially by PSNC, through savings made as a result of COVID-19 related travel restrictions; and
- The Group will not be a decision-making body it will be for all contractors to decide whether or not they want to accept whatever the RSG proposes to them.

The proposal for the RSG stresses the critical need for the group to fully engage contractors in the next steps of this work – the group will need a comprehensive communications plan, and we expect it to update contractors via webinars on a regular basis.

GP referrals to CPCS: Engagement and setup payment

From 1st November 2020, the NHS Community Pharmacist Consultation Service (CPCS) was extended across England to include minor illness referrals from general practices as well as from NHS 111. We expect general practices across individual Primary Care Networks to start to make referrals to the service over the next few months, once the preparatory work has been undertaken at a local level.

Contractors registered to provide the CPCS will be able to support this local preparatory work and they can claim a £300 engagement and setup payment if they undertake a range of actions to get ready for rolling out the referral pathway in their area. The requirements are detailed in **Annex F of the updated CPCS service specification** and further guidance will be issued on this shortly.

Contractors that were part of the pilot for the referral pathway are likely to be able to quickly meet the requirements listed in Annex F and will be in a position to claim the payment. Where local preparations to roll out the referral pathway have not yet progressed in a locality, it is unlikely that contractors will be able to meet the requirements in Annex F at this time; contractors should only claim the payment where they have fully met the requirements of Annex F.

NHSE&I Community Pharmacy Webinar

NHS England and NHS Improvement (NHSE&I) are holding a webinar for community pharmacy teams on **Thursday 12th November**, **6pm to 7pm**.
