<u>Temperature management for medicines storage:</u>

Best practice advice to help you understand temperature management, prevent problems occurring and managing temperature excursions that occur.

Advice includes control and monitoring of temperature in ambient, refrigerated and freezer storage areas.

<u>Switching between gabapentin and pregabalin for neuropathic pain -</u> overview of possible dose equivalences, switching methods and considerations to make before switching between gabapentinoids in adults with neuropathic pain.

<u>Using Selective Serotonin Reuptake Inhibitor (SSRI) antidepressants during</u> <u>breastfeeding</u> - paroxetine and sertraline are the SSRIs of choice. Recommendations apply to full term and healthy infants only.

<u>Using codeine, dihydrocodeine or tramadol during breastfeeding</u> - tramadol and dihydrocodeine can be used while breastfeeding for pain control. Codeine should not be used. Advice applies to full term, healthy infants.

<u>Switching between imatinib preparations</u> - Support for decision making when considering switching imatinib preparations including a locally adaptable patient information leaflet.

Assurance of aseptic preparation of medicines - insight and links to updated guidance from NHSE to reflect governance and visibility of the assurance and audit of unlicensed aseptic preparation.

<u>iQAAPS (interactive Quality Assurance of Aseptic Preparation Services) Digital Audit Tool</u>

The iQAAPS system is now being rolled out across England. The system is being introduced to improve oversight and support quality improvement in unlicenced aseptic units.

Units will now submit pre-audit information, receive audit reports and build action plans within the system. Units with an upcoming audit will be provided with accounts for the system and invited to a training session for its use.

SUPPLY ISSUES MANAGED BY RPPS

Remdesivir: Ongoing top-up allocations are being made.

IVIg: Due to a further decrease in available volumes of some IVIg products we have reverted to formal allocations. Allocations for February and March are currently being finalised and will then be sent out to Trusts.

Alteplase: Allocations for February have been sent out to Trusts.

OncoTICE®: Weekly allocations for the next 13 weeks have been sent out to Trusts.

SUPPLY

<u>Epidural Bags:</u> There is a supply issue with a range of epidural bags containing fentanyl and levobupivacaine or bupivacaine. A National Patient Safety Alert has been issued to guide Trusts on the management of this issue.

<u>Imiquimod:</u> There are supply issues with both manufacturers of Imiquimod 5% sachets. An MSN is being prepared to provide guidance on treatment options.

<u>Idacio</u>[®]: There is a supply constraint on this product. There is stock for current patients, however new patients need to be started on an alternative during this time.
