HOT TOPICS

Assurance of aseptic preparation of medicines: new guidance has been published by NHSE relating to the Assurance of aseptic preparation of medicines. This guidance sets out the governance and regulatory arrangements for aseptic preparation of medicines for NHS patients in England and replaces the 1997 NHS Executive letter EL(97)52, Aseptic dispensing in NHS hospitals.

SUPPLY ISSUES MANAGED BY RPPS

<u>Remdesivir:</u> All remaining stock has been allocated and only residual stock in Trusts remains. There is no intention for further central procurement. <u>NICE</u> <u>TA878 for treating covid-19 infection.</u>

<u>IVIg:</u> Due to a further decrease in available volumes of some IVIg products we have reverted to formal allocations. Trusts will be informed of allocations for April onwards. Please can Trusts ensure they purchase their allocations.

<u>Alteplase</u>: Allocations for April have been sent out to Trusts. The supply position remains constrained and cannot support any further increase in use.

<u>Ceftazidime</u>: There are supply issues with a number of suppliers for both 1g and 2 g strengths. To support stockpile product was released and this has all now been allocated to Trusts as needed.





SUPPLY

Epidural Bags: There is a supply issue with a range of epidural bags containing fentanyl and levobupivacaine or bupivacaine. A <u>National Patient Safety Alert</u> has been issued to guide Trusts on the management of this issue. Supply position going forwards across all products is being closely monitored.

<u>Adalimumab</u>: The new CMU framework goes live on 1st April. This is significantly different as it is now an open framework covering all products.

Ranibizumab: The new CMU framework goes live on 1st April. This now includes a further 2 biosimilar ranibizumab products.
