Holiday Fraud

Holiday fraud is when a criminal impersonates trusted companies or creates a fake company to trick you into booking a holiday through them and giving out your personal or financial information. Most holiday scams take place online.

Criminals set up fake websites and online ads that appear to sell flights, holiday packages, accommodation, and tour operator packages (which often look "too good to be true").



Look out for:

- Being asked to pay via bank transfer rather than a secure payment platform.
- The website you're purchasing from was only launched a few days/weeks ago.
- You're asked to pay an invoice you haven't yet received. For further advice visit Take Five


Police & Crime Commissioner Public Survey
