

Community Rehabilitation: Long-term Conditions Short Course

Level 7 (postgraduate) 15 credits | Course fee £900

Course Overview

This short course/ module will focus on physical activity approaches for people with long-term conditions. With a strong focus on building skills, knowledge and confidence for the population who live with long term conditions, this module will enable the learner to explore and appraise theories and application of behaviour change models and the social model of disability. The learner will explore population health approaches, social determinants of health and health inequalities to understand the needs of the local population, analysis and evaluation of factors and processes that facilitate effective collaboration within a multidisciplinary team, will ensure that learners are confident in developing innovative, transformative solutions / interventions that are community based and population driven.

This module is taught at Level 7 (postgraduate) level which required students to engage as independent, critical thinkers. It carries 15 academic credits, which represents a total of 150 hours of effort. In addition to the taught sessions, the learners will be required to undertake self-directed study, including reading, research and work-based quality improvement (QI) project. Learners will need to pass the assessment task to be awarded the Level 7 credits.

Course assessment:

Learners will undertake an appropriate quality improvement project (manageable in the given timeframe) that will be assessed by producing an academic poster and online presentation and critical reflection.

The course assessment must be completed, and passed, to be awarded 15 L7 (MSc) academic credits.

Students will be invited to present their to practice representatives and University of Winchester colleagues at a showcasing day later in the year.

Entry Requirements

Evidence provided of first degree with an award at first or upper second-class Honours level, normally awarded in the past six years or equivalent professional experience from a recognised Education Provider.

Evidence of educational and practice currency related to their current role.

Current registration (or eligibility for registration) with HCPC, NMC or GPhC.

Evidence of at least three years of relevant, recent, and contemporary experience, normally in, or working towards, an advanced practice role.

Currently working in or towards, an advanced practice role with support from employer to attend programme and to complete supervised practice components of the programme.

If English is not first language: IELTS 7.0 overall, including a minimum of 6.5 in each of the components.
