

AP7004 Community Rehabilitation: Healthy Ageing Short Course

Level 7 (postgraduate) 15 credits | Course fee £900

Course Overview

This short course/ module will enable the learner to explore rehabilitation theories, and interventions offered for populations to encourage their healthy ageing. The learner will develop critical skills to enhance their own rehabilitation practice and enable a self-managed approach to their clinical practice. The module will be relevant to learners working in hospital and home teams, urgent community response teams, as well as frailty services, community nursing and therapy teams, and bed based reablement and rehabilitation.

This module is taught at Level 7 (postgraduate) level which required students to engage as independent, critical thinkers. It carries 15 academic credits, which represents a total of 150 hours of effort. In addition to the taught sessions, the learners will be required to undertake self-directed study, including reading, research and work-based quality improvement (QI) project. Learners will need to pass the assessment task to be awarded the Level 7 credits.

Course assessment:

Learners will undertake an appropriate quality improvement project (manageable in the given timeframe) that will be assessed by producing a poster and presentation and critical reflection. The work will be presented to practice representatives and University of Winchester colleagues. The

students will each be given time to present their poster presentations at a showcasing day, to share their work and findings.

The course assessment must be completed, and passed, to be awarded 15 L7 (MSc) academic credits. The Conference assessment is scheduled for Thursday 18 July 2024.

Entry Requirements

Evidence provided of first degree with an award at first or upper second-class Honours level, normally awarded in the past six years or equivalent professional experience from a recognised Education Provider.

Evidence of educational and practice currency related to their current role.

Current registration (or eligibility for registration) with HCPC, NMC or GPhC.

Evidence of at least three years of relevant, recent, and contemporary experience, normally in, or working towards, an advanced practice role.

Currently working in or towards, an advanced practice role with support from employer to attend programme and to complete supervised practice components of the programme.

If English is not first language: IELTS 7.0 overall, including a minimum of 6.5 in each of the components.
